<b>6 Angelicum Great Books Courses</b> (6 credits each - 4 of these courses are offered each semester)	<b>36</b> (only 33 Great Books credits are needed for the A.A., however these are 6 credits per semester, so to earn 33 credits requires 6 Great Books courses: the extra 3 credits may be later applied to the Holy Apostles B.A. degree)

If you complete any of the following Angelicum courses (left), they are considered equivalent to the Holy Apostles courses to the right. However, both A.A. degrees require completion of a minimum of 15 Holy Apostles credits (usually = 5 courses).
